A Woman and Her God

<u>Summary</u>: This seminar is a time of reflection and fellowship to discuss what women should strive for in their relationship with the Lord: to know Him and grow in Him; to study and meditate on His Word; to have a daily prayer time; to praise Him; and to have fellowship with other believers. Great for women's group numbering 10 to 40.

Basics of Discipleship

Of primary note is session III, which takes participants through the five principal aspects of spiritual formation - Scripture, prayer, spirit-filled living, holiness, and compassion - as outlined in Richard Foster's *Renovaré* movement.

If we could look at our Christian life as a tree, we would see the inner disciplines as the roots that connect us to God, but which others do not always see. "*Basics of Discipleship*" deals with the inner disciplines of one's spiritual formation. Outer disciplines, on the other hand, act as the fruits that show a visible result of a life lived in Christ. "*Discipleship as a Lifestyle*" focuses on the outer discipline of stewardship, involving the use of our time, talent, and treasure. It also focuses on dealing with temptations, which leads away from the proper use of our God given resources.

Be fore-warned that all students will be expected to be PARTICIPANTS! After a short time of instruction, each person will have the opportunity to line out and lead a song or read a favorite passage of Scripture. Every person will be given time and guidance in how to write and deliver a personal testimony, and then share it with one other person. Finally, everyone will have the privilege of praying in a small group using a simple format or prompt, if necessary. This will be a time of encouragement, equipping and empowering for God's servants! We understand that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23), but yet God chooses to use us in His service through The Salvation Army. We can rejoice that He uses the foolish, weak and lowly of this world to shame the wise

and the strong (1 Corinthians 1:27-29).
